Based on these revisions, the factor to adjust to 1999 constant dollars in Table DP-3 would be 242.7/187.0, or 1.297861, and the factor to adjust to 2000 constant dollars in Table DP-4 would be 250.8/196.3, or 1.277636.

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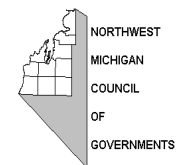
